JCDL 2009 invites papers, posters, demonstrations, as well as tutorials, workshop and panel proposals that will make the conference an exciting and creative event to attend. Participation is sought from all parts of the world and from the full range of disciplines and professions involved in digital library research and practice, including computer science, information science, librarianship, archival science and practice, museum studies and practice, technology, medicine, social sciences, and humanities.

Paper Submissions

Authors may choose between two formats: full and short papers. Both formats will be rigorously peer reviewed.

Full papers report on mature work or efforts that have reached an important milestone. Full papers must not exceed 10 pages.

Short papers report on significant results that do not require the full paper length for exposition. Short papers might highlight exciting early results or can present theories or systems that can be described concisely in the limited space. Short papers must not exceed 4 pages.

All papers must be original contributions. The material must not have been previously published or be under review for publication elsewhere. Both formats will be included in the proceedings and will be presented at the conference. **All accepted papers will be published by ACM as conference proceedings and electronic versions will be included into the ACM Digital Library.**

All Submissions

All contributions (papers, posters, demonstrations, as well as proposals for tutorials, workshops and panels) must be written in English. All submissions are to be made electronically in PDF format and following ACM format guidelines. To prepare their submissions, authors should use the ACM template available at: <http://www.acm.org/sigs/publications/proceedings-templates>

Important Dates:

January 23, 2009 All papers are due by 5pm CST.
January 31, 2009 Poster and demonstration submissions are due by 5pm CST.
January 31, 2009 Tutorial, panel, and workshop proposals are due by 5pm CST.
